



IMPACT REPORT 2017/18

We are proud to share stories of how the generosity of Taranaki people can have a powerful impact on the lives of many. This year we have gifted Taranaki people and organisations \$64,000 and \$23,000 on behalf of the Tindall Foundation.

Te Karaka Foundation

Established in 2016, Te Karaka is the charitable foundation established for Taranaki, our people and the causes that are important to us. Through giving we positively impact the community and contribute to our mission of helping build a thriving Taranaki: an outstanding place to live, learn, work and play, now and for generations to come.

By 2025 we aim to distribute \$450,000 each year in local grants.

WHO WE'VE HELPED

Hearing and Visually Impaired People

A generous woman established a fund for the hearing and visually impaired community and with this fund young children through to a 72-year-old have received a tandem bike, a laptop for a tertiary student, specialised alarms for the hearing impaired, a Phonak Roger Pen and cochlear implant covers.

"As the kids get older it is more important that they can be independent and know they can take action themselves and not have to rely on others if there was a threat of fire or just set an alarm to wake themselves up"

"Devices like these come down to a window of inclusion in everyday life. Thomas can now swim in the sea and swimming pools, hear team mates on a rainy day at football and even play in the rain, just the same as everyone else. No one wants their kid trailing behind having to rely on others to figure out what's going on and constantly using their other senses to keep up"

Community

Five community groups are benefiting from gifts via Te Karaka to help with everything from budgeting support through to pepi pods for newborns. Recipients include Pregnancy Help Taranaki Inc, New Plymouth Positive Ageing Trust, On The House, Hawera Budget Advisory Service and New Plymouth Emergency Shelter.

"Last year we provided more than 1100 bed nights and we are seeing a greater demand for emergency shelter this year,"

"With only three paid staff, we rely on volunteers to help meet the demand for our services and provide mentoring to our clients. With this funding we can pay for volunteers' training costs, travel expenses and safety items,"

Young People

The Taranaki Toy Library, CCS Disability Action Taranaki and Taranaki Blue Light Ventures are supporting our young people via gifts from Te Karaka.

"Every year we have two to three students who need help developing an action plan to bridge the gap between school and employment and the support to put it in place."

Education

Young people from Taranaki have received educational scholarships for Conductive Education, MindPlus, the Ohangai Centennial Teaching Scholarship from the Winifred Knight Trust and books for Opunake High School's mentoring programme.

"The books make a real difference to the programme and is something the students can take with them into their life beyond school."

At Risk Youth

A generous Taranaki family and a philanthropic woman gave gifts to get START Early, a project run by START Taranaki off the ground. START Early is an early intervention preventative programme that works with Taranaki boys who are at high risk of offending.

"We couldn't do this work without the support of the wider community. START Taranaki's nationally based programme is funded by Ministry of Social Development and Oranga Tamariki. The START Early Programme however, relies on the generosity of a wide range of grant funders, sponsors and private donors."

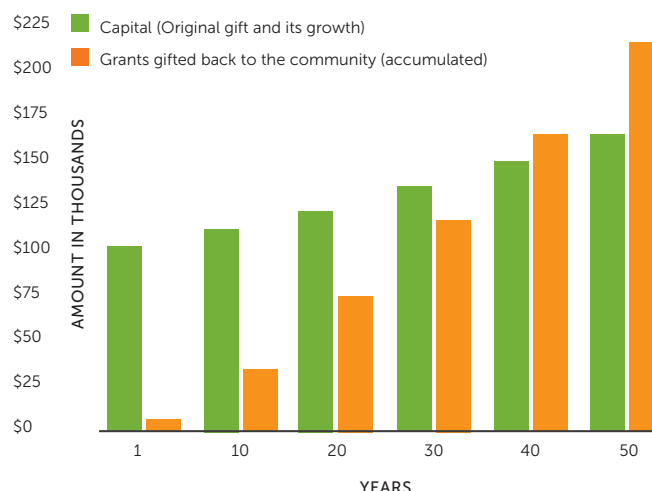
Grantmaking Support
