We are here to nurture and build the prosperity of our region. We do this by connecting generous people to activities that create transformational differences in peoples' lives, and by providing philanthropic advice, community knowledge and leadership.



2020/21 Snapshot

No one could have imagined the challenges that lay ahead for our communities at the start of 2020. Like the rest of the world in 2020 Covid-19 had an impact on our local community and on the work of the Foundation.

The community foundation model celebrates and enables place-based giving – a way for people to give back and make a difference for their region. With Taranaki Foundation your charitable giving makes a real, positive difference that will be felt throughout our region for generations to come.

The highlight for the Foundation was distributing \$87,000 (1 April 2020 – 31 March 2021) to our community. This was a significant increase on recent years thanks to additional funding streams.


