#### Tēnā koutou katoa,

It is our pleasure to bring you the 2021/22 Taranaki Foundation Impact Report.

These are challenging times for many in our community amidst an uncertain and worrying period in the world. Here at Taranaki Foundation, we are on a mission to grow giving and philanthropy, matching generous people and organisations with our region's important community causes.

To the end of 31 March 2022 Endowment Funds under management have grown to \$2.05m, up from \$1.02m in 2021. A record 82 grants were made, totalling over \$186k in distributions across our various funding streams. The value of committed and indicated bequests in Wills sits at \$5m, up from \$2.5m in 2021. With the help of our donors, we will continue to build funds to create a reliable, long-term funding stream for local causes now and into the future.



As ever, our deep gratitude goes to those who are helping us to grow and expand the Foundation.

Taranaki Foundation together with, local hapū Ngāti Te Whiti, NP Partners and NPDC have been working together since early 2021 to develop Destination Play, a visionary play space at Kāwaroa Park. With work set to begin early next year, the \$5.5m project has already secured 65% of the funding, and the remainder is being raised through public and philanthropic donations, sponsorship and other channels. We're inviting everyone to get involved and contribute to this ambitious community project.

We acknowledge the work and support from Community Foundations New Zealand (CFNZ), our national body. We are proud to be one of 17 Community Foundations across Aoteroa New Zealand growing funds and long-term community impact. The latest figures show that collectively an incredible \$231m is managed across the network.

We also extend our warmest congratulations to The Tindall Foundation on reaching an incredible milestone - giving out over \$200 million to New Zealand communities, organisations and charities over the past 27 years! We are enormously grateful for their dedication and support, which has enabled so many local groups to make a significant difference in our Taranaki community.

As ever, our deep gratitude goes to those who are helping us to grow and expand the Foundation. Whether you are a donor, supporter, funding partner, volunteer, grant recipient, professional advisor, charitable partner or community leader, you have all played a significant role in the story of Taranaki Foundation to date. We thank you for your continued partnership and love for our community.

In 2021 this Fund was transferred to the Foundation to enhance the provision of medical services within Taranaki and specifically within cancer hospice facilities.

#### Liquigas Limited Endowment Fund


Established to support corporate charitable giving and build a fund specifically earmarked for the communities. Liquigas operate in across New Zealand.

#### 2021 Tindall Foundation Funding for Taranaki:

The focus of this pass-through fund is to support organisations helping others in need, particularly those that help people suffering hardship. Also sporting bodies with whom Bruce has been associated in Taranaki.

In 2021/2 twenty-six grants were made directly to charitable organisations and four grants made to Taranaki-based sporting bodies.

#### Coach McKean Fund

The memory of Steve 'Coach' McKean will live on through this Fund, to benefit emerging Taranaki sportspeople. In 2022 the Future Champions Programme with Sport Taranaki was funded through the Coach McKean Fund. Six promising Year 13 Taranaki athletes have been selected for the Tier 1 programme and have begun a programme of workshops and professional support tailored to their needs.

#### Connect Legal Taranaki Fund

Connect Legal Taranaki established a fund with Taranaki Foundation in 2016 (formerly Billings Lawyers Fund) to more carefully plan and structure their giving whilst at the


