Taranaki Foundation is one of 17 community foundations throughout Aotearoa New Zealand. The Foundation invites individuals, families and organisations to leave a lasting gift to the Taranaki community by establishing an endowment fund or contributing to an established fund. The donation is invested and makes grants to the community in perpetuity from the financial returns earned on invested funds. The Foundation also engages in and sometimes leads other activities or projects on a case-by-case basis.

Taranaki Foundation Trustees:

- Taranaki Foundation's voluntary Trustees have a deep, personal commitment to our region. They gift their time, community knowledge and professional expertise to lead Taranaki Foundation. They passionately believe in the power of philanthropy to transform lives and create a more vibrant, prosperous region for all.
